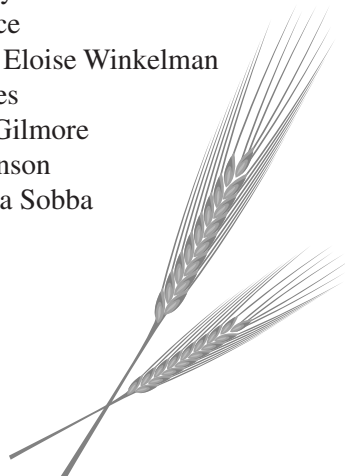

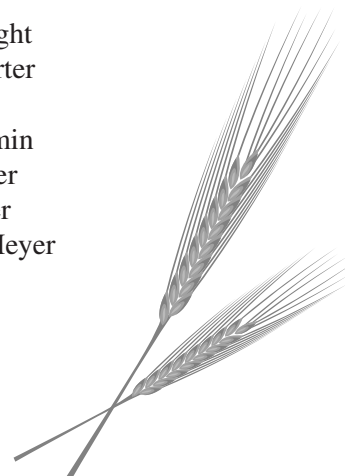

## Distinguished Citizen enjoyed work career at Isern Drilling

George A. Meyer was honored as 2010 Distinguished Citizen in Ellinwood. He was 96 years old when he passed away on April 11, 2010, after 62 years of marriage to Millicent (Noel) Meyer.

George and Millicent, 89, would've celebrated their 63rd anniversary June 24. Millicent was a teacher at Ellinwood Grade School until her retirement in 1985. "George never would've dreamed of this

honor, but it pleased him to be recognized," Millicent said. "It pleased him greatly."

Millicent said like most people, they had their ups and downs. They made their home in Ellinwood for 64 years. "We enjoyed a very good life together," she said.

One of their favorite places in Yellowstone Park, which they visited several times, including their honeymoon. When a cabin wasn't available, they didn't want to spend the extra money on an expensive room.

"We found a secluded spot and made ourselves comfortable in our car," Millicent said.

They returned several times over the years to Yellowstone, which held a special place in their hearts.

George worked as an accountant for Keyes Drilling which later became Isern Wells Drill-

ing Co. until he retired in 1984. He worked until he was 70 taking Isern Drilling into the computer age which never ceased to amaze him. After retirement he still met with the guys every morning for coffee at the Wheat Bowl office.

He also enjoyed being a member of the RO-MEOS (retired old men eating out).

"He was a very humble, compassionate man who cared deeply about others and always went out of his way to make them feel important," said his daughter Elaine DeTour-Spronken of Tucson, Ariz.

George was a common sight on his downtown walks. He enjoyed working in his yard and often saw friends and neighbors who were ill and suffering. He wanted to let them know that he cared and that they were not forgotten.

The decorated WWII

veteran achieved one dream when he joined the Honor Flight to see the WWII Memorial in Washington D.C. in October 2007.

He was a charter member of the Lions Club and a founding member of the Junior Chamber of Commerce. He was a lifetime member of the American Legion and VFW. And founding member of St. John's Lutheran Church and served as a church elder and Sunday School teacher.

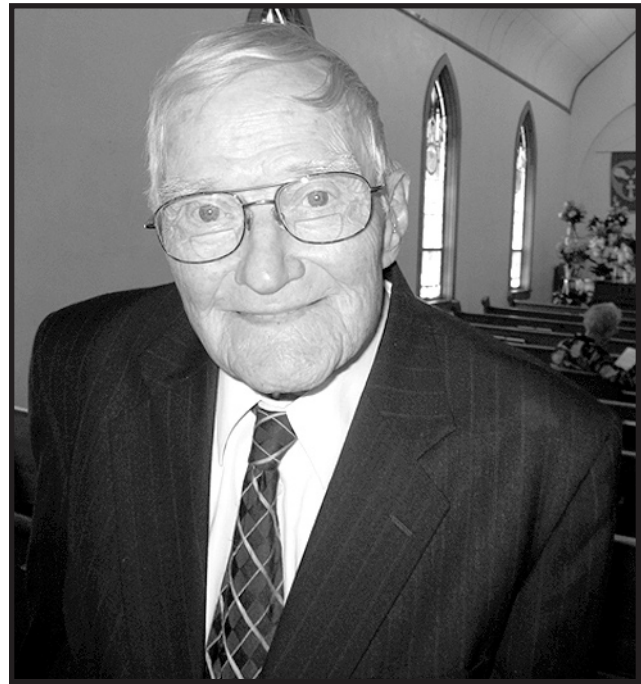
He made it a point to

"He let them know they were welcome to our community," said DeTour-Spronken. "I've had many people tell me of the lasting impression they have of my Dad greeting them when they moved to town."

He coached Little League baseball and was an active leader for the local Boy Scout troop.

He served as treasurer for the Ellinwood school board for more than 30 years.
